The Guyana Chess Federation (GCF) in collaboration with the CARICOM Secretariat Confederation of Chess for Americas (CCA) and the International Chess Federation (FIDE) are pleased to invite Federations of CARICOM Member States and Associate Members

to the inaugural CARICOM 50th Anniversary Classic Team Chess Tournament.

The flagship tournament will be held at the RAMADA GEORGETOWN PRIN-CESS HOTEL, Providence on the East Bank of Demerara from March 3-10,

General Conditions

The CARICOM 50th Anniversary Classic Team Tournament, 2024 will be held in accordance with FIDE Laws of Chess and the regulations for regional events of the CCA.

Categories

Each Federation is required to select and provide one team comprising two female and two male players who are residents of CARICOM Member States or Associate Members and are Junior or Senior players.

If a team has insufficient participants or lacks gender balance, the organizers will review the challenges presented by the respective territory as soon as possible and communicate its decision before the tournament.

Federations from the following territories are invited to participate:

All participants must be registered by their respective federation.

Each national chess federation may register four players, along with a coach or delegate to represent their respective territory. Guyana, as the host nation, will field two teams. Federations may also choose to register optional reserve players who will only be allowed to play in cases of emergency.

By registering for the tournament, the federation and the participants, as well as their representatives, confirm they have read and accepted all regulations, terms, and conditions of the tournament.



System of Play:

The Games will be a Swiss System of nine (9) rounds or Round Robin dependent on the number of players and the discretion of the Chief Arbiter.

The rhythm of play will be ninety (90) minutes for all moves, plus an increment of thirty (30) seconds per move from move one (1). The event will be FIDE-rated.

Points:

Individual boards would score team points as follows: Win - 1 point, Draw - $\frac{1}{2}$ point, Loss 0 points. These points will be added together to arrive at the total points scored by the team for that match. These totals will be used to determine the result of the match and the allocation of team points.

- 2 points for a match where a team has scored more points than the opposing team
- 1 point for a drawn match where both team have scored an equal amount of points.
- 0 points for a match when a team has scored less points than the opposing team.

Example:

If the players in Team A won 2 games, lost 1 game and drew 1 game, the players would have accumulated a total 2.5 points, with the opposing team's accumulated score being 1.5 points. Team A would accrue 2 Match Points and the opposing team would score 0 match points.

Tiebreaks:

The final placings will be decided by the points obtained by each player from each team. The team that accumulates the most points will be declared the winner, and hence the territory the team represents, the overall winner of the tournament. In the case of ties, the winners will be decided by the implementation of the following tie-break systems in the order mentioned:

- 1. Match points
- 2. Total number of game points scored
- 3. Direct Encounter
- 4. Sonneborn-Berger

Pairings and Results:

Before the beginning of the First Round of the event, a list with all the names of participants will be published in the playing hall. The Pairings will be published at least one hour after the last game of each round, at the tournament's Official webpage or Chess-results.com and at the venue's hall.

Default Time:

The player who has not made a move thirty (30) minutes after the official start of the rounds shall lose his/her game.





Discipline:

The Organizers expect the highest standards of behavior and fair play by the participants.

Fair play/Electronic equipment:

Fair Play measures will be applied in accordance with the FIDE Anti-Doping Guidelines. With the exception of play recording equipment, during a game, players are prohibited from having any electronic device at the venue that has not been specifically approved by the arbiter.

Such devices can be stored in a player's bag, as long as the device is completely turned off. This bag must be placed as agreed with the arbiter and the player is prohibited from using it without the arbiter's permission. Companions or spectators are prohibited from using electronic devices at the place of play, except to take photographs when explicitly approved by the arbiter.

Attire:

Players are requested to maintain a dignified appearance at all times during the tournament. Slippers, shorts, sun glasses, sports caps, ripped jeans, camouflage and revealing attire are not allowed.

Prizes:

Cash Prizes will be presented to the winning Federations based on the tournament results from First to Third Place in the following amounts:

- First Place: USD \$1,500 (One Thousand Five Hundred United States Dollars)
- Second Place: USD \$1,000 (One Thousand United States Dollars)
- Third Place: USD \$500 (Five Hundred United States Dollars)

Medals and Trophies

Team: First, Second and Third place trophies will be awarded to the top three CARICOM Territories, based on tournament results.

Individual: Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the players of the first three CARICOM teams.

The technical meeting will be hosted on the evening of Sunday, March 3, 2024. At the start of the meeting, the 5-member Appeals Committee shall be formed.

Participant's Cost

The first TEN territories to complete the registration process will receive complimentary meals and accommodation from the Guyana Chess Federation. This offer is limited to 5 persons per territory - 4 players and 1 coach/ delegate, and includes dinner on March 3, 2024 to breakfast on Sun March 10, 2024. All other players, reserve players, coaches and delegates will be required to cover their own accommodation and meals at the corresponding rates for double or single rooms, where applicable.

Accommodation packages are priced per person and include all meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) for the period from dinner on March 3, 2024 to breakfast on Sun. March 10, 2024. The packages also include transportation between the airport and the Ramada Georgetown Princess Hotel

Players who do not wish to stay at the official hotel must make an additional payment of \$100.00 (USD) per person, and will be responsible for their own transportation costs.
